Foreword

A completely new department – Department of Sports and Youth Affairs – was created in July 1995 to provide the much-needed platform to the growing youth population in the state. Since then, we have undertaken promotion of sports in a big way by introducing various programmes and organising sport competitions and youth festivals, trainings for youths and holding talent search schemes such as "Search for more Bhaichungs" and more recently the Late LD Kazi Memorial Football Cup State level interschool football tournament.

We have also paid special attention to building new sports infrastructure as well as upgrading existing ones. A large number of schools and college halls have also been remodelled as indoor stadiums for games like badminton, table tennis and boxing.

The results have been positive: the number of sportspersons from Sikkim winning medals in national and international events has grown every year. So far around 480 sportspersons have received cash incentives given annually by the state government on the basis of medal won in the Olympics, Asian Games, National Games or North East Games.

I am delighted that these and many other initiatives of the state government from 1995 to 2016 are so beautifully documented in this compendium titled, "Youth Empowerment in Sikkim: The Sports Way".

This is also an ode to the effort put in by the department officials and staff to the service of the people of Sikkim. I congratulate the department for the effort.



Introduction

In May 2014, Mr. Pawan Chamling was sworn in as Sikkim's chief minister for a record fifth time. But it was barely seven months after first taking charge in December 1994 that the chief minister opened the doors for youth empowerment. He created a completely new department – Department of Sports and Youth Affairs in July 1995 – to cater to the needs and aspirations of the growing youth population in the state. This department has been one of Mr. Chamling's biggest achievements.

Sports and physical education play a crucial role in all-round development, especially of children and young adults. By creating a separate department, the chief minister put the focus on youth and sports. Many sportspersons over the years have brought laurels to the state as well as to the country. They include Late Sonam Gyatso, mountaineer and Arjuna Awardee; Bhaichung Bhutia, footballer, an Arjuna Awardee and Padmashri; Jaslal Pradhan, a boxer and Arjun

Awardee; and Tarundeep Rai, an archer and Arjuna Awardee, to name a few. This list of sports achievers has only grown every year.

Over the past 20 years, the sports and youth affairs department, under the good governance policy of the state, has led massive development of sport infrastructure in Sikkim. This is no mean achievement in a state that has mountainous terrain and inclement weather.

In Gangtok, Paljor Stadium, formerly a polo ground, was upgraded into an ultramodern stadium in 2005 and is today one of the best football grounds in India. The department has also developed infrastructure in the districts to provide universal access to sports in rural areas. It has constructed a playground at Mangan in the north district; a playground at Soreng in west Sikkim; upgraded the playground at Geyzing, also in west Sikkim; built a Sports Complex at Khel Gaon, Reshithang and multi-purpose indoor stadiums in all four districts; and developed an archery complex in Gangtok. Also, an international level football stadium is being



built at Namchi, and named after Bhaichung Bhutia, Sikkim's football export to the world and former captain of the Indian football team.

The department has also promoted various schemes and programmes, such as hosting national and regional tournaments and sports festivals, introduction of cash incentives for outstanding sportspersons and sports competitions, and government sponsorship for training of athletes. These schemes and programmes have provided opportunities to the youth to play and have encouraged them to take up sports as a profession.

On 15 August 2012, India's Independence Day, the chief minister announced cash incentives of Rs. 2 crore, Rs. I crore and Rs. 50 lakhs for any sportsperson from Sikkim who wins a gold, silver or bronze medal at the Olympics. There are cash incentives for those who bring home medals from the Asian Games, Commonwealth Games and other national level games, including the North Eastern Sports Festival. The state government has also decided to honour such sportspersons with an announcement in the official state gazette.

The department has been able to reach the remotest corners of Sikkim by developing several initiatives such as football tournament in Chakung in West Sikkim and paragliding in hilly locations. This has not only encouraged the youth to take up new sports but has also added to the state's sports tourism business. Under the chief minister's capacity building programme, the department has sent hundreds of youth to Himachal Pradesh and Nepal for training as paragliding pilots.

Identifying and nurturing sports talent from the grassroots have always been a top priority for the government. The department has succeeded in this regard with two important schemes. "Search for more Bhaichungs" is a scheme started in 2004-05, and many footballers who have come out from the coaching under this scheme have today joined national sport clubs while some others play in the Indian Super League. The Late L.D. Kazi Memorial Gold Cup State Level Inter School Football Tournament introduced in 2014 is along the lines of the "Search for more Bhaichungs" scheme. Every year, students from all the 68 senior secondary schools of Sikkim compete and the best team gets to play for the prestigious Subroto Mukherjee Cup in New Delhi.

In another significant development, the department after receiving the operational guidelines of 'Khelo India – National Programme for Development of Sports Programme' has already sent a proposal for conduct of annual sports competition during 2016-17. Khelo India has been prepared by amalgamating the erstwhile Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan, Urban Sports Infrastructure Scheme and National Sports Talent Search System Programme as a Central Sector Scheme for implementation from the Financial year 2016-17. It has three components: competitions, talent and sports infrastructure.

The department may be small in size but its role in locating and nurturing sports talent through various schemes and programmes or in developing sports infrastructure of international standards is unmatched. These achievements have been possible due to the positive optimism with which the chief minister leads from the front. Most recently, the chief minister envisioned the constitution of a separate board, called the Sikkim Youth Development Board. It was established on I August 2014 with Mr. Khem Prasad Dahal as chairman. Just one more step towards ensuring proper development of the future generation and to energise the youth development process.






Development of Sports Infrastructure

To boost sporting activities in the state, a number of sports infrastructure have been created both at the state and district levels. Two of the best sports infrastructure of international standards created by this government are Paljor Stadium in Gangtok and the Sports Complex with Athletics Stadium at Khel Gaon, Reshithang. There are currently six major sports infrastructure being developed, with a majority of them being stadiums and playgrounds. The objective of the state government is to develop infrastructure in all the four districts so as to provide universal access to sports in rural areas and to promote sports among both boys and girls.

The construction of Bhaichung Stadium at Namchi and upgradation of Kyongsa ground in Geyzing to international standards with track and field facilities are two main projects. These projects have been sanctioned for Rs 35.68 crore and Rs 27.98 crore, respectively, under Special Plan Assistance.

Under the Panchayat Yuva Krida aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA) scheme of the central government, the Sikkim government has constructed and improved 261 playgrounds – 166 in Gram Panchayat Units and 95 in Zilla Panchayat Units – between 2008-09 and 2012-13. Among these, 239 were upgraded while 22 were new. The development of these requisite infrastructures of various sporting activities has led to the growth of many sportspersons of national and international repute.











Major Projects Completed

State-of-the-art Paljor Stadium

Originally a polo ground, Paljor Stadium is today one of India's most beautiful stadiums with an international size turfed football field, electronic scoreboard, hostel accommodation, VIP lounge, physiotherapy centre, fitness centre, in-built public address system and, most interestingly, an indoor hall for basketball. It fulfills a long-cherished desire of the people of Sikkim for a modern stadium.

This state-of-the art stadium was inaugurated by former President Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam on 22 September 2005 in presence of Chief Minister Mr. Chamling. With the chief minister's vision and guidance, the sporting ground has undergone major renovation at an estimated cost of Rs. 30.70 crore. It has a seating capacity of 25,000 spectators and many major events have been hosted here. The ground is open for all footballers and other sportspersons for regular practice and coaching camps – all they need to show is their identity card to enter and use the facilitates.



To add value to the stadium, and keeping up with the current worldwide trend of floodlit matches, the department installed floodlights, including a diesel generator set and electronic digital score board, so that night football matches and tournaments can be held.

With Astroturf spread across a handsome 93,000+ sq. feet, Paljor Stadium is perhaps the largest Astroturf in the SAARC region. The 65mm thick turf is filled with compressed rubber and silica making it suitable for Gangtok weather and has received positive endorsement from players of repute,

including Bhaichung Bhutia. The Astroturf was acquired at a cost of Rs 3.77 crore from reputed manufacturer FieldTurf Tarkett, based in the United States. It was laid by Great Sports Infrastructure, Hyderabad.

The Astroturf was inaugurated by the chief minister on 28 May 2011 with much fanfare. The inauguration event featured an exhibition match between Bhaichung Bhutia's United Sikkim Football Club and Minister's XI, which included Sikkimese footballers playing in different clubs around the country and some foreign players.

Sports Complex at Khel Gaon, Reshithang

The prestigious athletics stadium at Khel Gaon is one of the chief minister's dream projects. Construction began after acquiring 10.5 acres of land at Reshithang, which is around 10 kilometres from Gangtok town. The chief minister laid the foundation stone of the project on 22 April 2008. The Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India, sanctioned an amount of Rs. 24.20 crore for construction, with National Building Construction Corporation (NBCC) as the executing agency. The tracks in this international size athletics sports ground are made of material imported from Holland.

Speaking at the inauguration of the complex on 2 May 2013, the chief minister said that the younger generation and sportspersons could take full advantage of the facilities on offer at the stadium, and bring laurels not only to the state but also to India with their sterling performances in national and international sporting events. He also announced that the government would support the ambitions of young adults who wish to take up careers in football, archery, boxing, athletics, and other games. He offered state-sponsored coaching for these games. He also urged the youth to be focused and determined in their targets and goals, and use the infrastructure built by the government for their benefit.

The sports complex at Khel Gaon, which was under the Department of Sports and Youth Affairs, was handed over to the police department in 2016.

Namchi Indoor Stadium:

Constructed at a total expenditure of Rs. 3.6 crore, Namchi Indoor Stadium/Multipurpose Community Hall Centre was inaugurated on 8 September 2005. It has both playing and practising facilities for basketball, volleyball, badminton, table tennis, combat sports, and fitness centre with multi-gym facilities.

Youth Promotion

"Search for more Bhaichungs" Scheme

As a logical step to broad basing sports at the school and the club level, the state government had on April 2, 1999 launched a scheme named after the former Indian football captain and Sikkim's export to the world— Search for more Bhaichungs – for boys under 14. This is a scheme envisioned by the chief minister to spot upcoming football talents and nurture them.

The same year, the government also set up a Sports Hostel in Namchi, south Sikkim to translate the chief minister's dreams of spotting more football talents in the state into reality.

Each year trainees get added to the hostel

through talent hunt conducted by the department. Boys selected from all over the state are given free food, lodging, sports kits and constant coaching at the sports hostel besides free education. However, boys who fail to perform get weeded out of the facility.

The trainees at Sports Hostel, Namchi undergo four years of training, after which a promising team is sent to participate in junior national football tournament. The trainees, who graduate from the Sports Hostel, Namchi also get automatically admitted to Gangtok Sports Academy, also formed under the "Search for More Bhaichungs" scheme in 2006, for further training and higher education.

Presently there are 30 boys undergoing training at Sports Hostel, Namchi, and another group of 30 boys at Gangtok Sports Academy.

Impact: Since its inception, "Search for More Bhaichungs" scheme has yielded I30 players from Gangtok Sports Academy, out of which 28 boys have been inducted with renowned clubs playing in Indian Super League and also with other football clubs in India. A total of I3 players have been employed with Sikkim Police, Indian Reserve Battalion, Indo-Tibetan Border Police on sports quota. Six boys have been recruited by the Indian Army and Indian Navy.

Sanju Pradhan and Nirmal Chetri, among the first batch of the 30 shortlisted players who had graduated to Gangtok Sports Academy in 2006 got picked up by Air India coach when both players displayed sterling performance during the Governor's Gold Cup at Paljor Stadium in 2010.

Among those picked up by clubs playing in Indian Super League are: Sanju Pradhan for Pune City FC, Nirmal Chetri for Kerala Blasters, Bikash Jairu for Aletico de Kolkata and Robin Gurung for NorthEast United Football Club.

Kunzang Lachungpa (goal keeper) was selected by Lajong FC, Shillong and included in the team of North East for Indian Super League twice. Now he is earning above Rs 20 lakhs per session.

Phurba Lachenpa was also picked up by Lajong FC for his performance in goal keeping while Nim Dorjee Tamang has been selected by Lajong FC.

Constitution of Sikkim Youth Development Board

Keen to ensure the proper development of youth to enable them to shoulder responsibilities in the future, the government has started various youth-oriented programmes. These programmes facilitate the youth and ensure their participation in the development of society and the state. The government constituted the Sikkim Youth Development Board on I August 2014 to add vigour to the youth development process. Mr. Khem Prasad Dahal was appointed as chairman of the board.

The board will function to harness the talents of the youth and provide opportunities to build their leadership and professional skills, and their capacities to contribute to the socio-economic development of the state. For this, the board has identified some major areas for intervention: unemployment, occupations based on aptitude, substance abuse, materialism, education disparity, poverty, erosion of national pride/identity, backwardness (social backwardness, educational backwardness, economic backwardness), and lack of sense of responsibility, accountability and ownership.

In its first meeting, held on 27 November 2014, the board decided: (I) Convergence of livelihood skill development schemes being carried out by various government departments and agencies, with the Sikkim Youth Development Board acting as nodal agency providing overall guidance; (2) Activities as envisaged by the board to be taken up within a budget of Rs I crore; (3) Policy issues will be the remit of the board, while actual implementation shall be carried out by the concerned government agencies; and (4) Programmes for school dropouts, such as value addition for local food products, pickle making, bamboo crafts, broom binding, vermin composting, decorative candle making, etc, to be conducted with the help of local experts.

In its second meeting, following key points were discussed: (1) Formation of State Youth Policy for the state government's mission "Sikkim Youth 2020" to help empower the youth; (2) discussion on establishment of State Institute for Research, Training and Development; (3) Compulsory implementation of NCC/NSS in secondary and senior secondary schools; (4) starting Chief Minister's Youth Award; (5) organising state youth festival once a year in order to participate in National Youth Festival and North East Youth Festival; and (5) to introduce karate, taekwondo and martial arts in schools.

In the course of two years, the Sikkim Youth Board in collaboration with Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, Sikkim Zone Gangtok has also undertaken various activities such as providing trainings, holding youth-centric conventions and attending youth festivals such as National Youth Festival and North East Youth Festival.



Trainings, Coaching Camps and Sports Festivals

Organising trainings and workshops for youth and coaching camps for athletes are important activities of the department. The adventure training programme under Border Area Development Programme at Yuksam, west Sikkim from 16 to 25 December 2013 involved 160 local youth.

Creation of a health club at White Hall recreational complex was also an initiative to encourage youth towards health and overall well-being.

In 1996, Sikkim hosted the national level North East Sports Festival in Gangtok and Mining Grounds. In 2010, 100 youth from Sikkim attended the 15th National Youth Festival held in Bhubaneshwar, Odisha from 8 to 12 January.

The Queen's baton rally for the Commonwealth Games, held in New Delhi in October 2010, was organised from 16 to 18 July in Sikkim. The torch rally for the 12th South

Asian Games was held in Gangtok on 29 and 30 January 2016.

The department has encouraged and sponsored youth interested in adventure sports like paragliding. As a result, paragliding has gradually become a popular sport in Sikkim and a source of livelihood for many young people. The government has promoted adventure tourism in the state and Sikkim has emerged on the nation's paragliding map.

Under the chief minister's Self-Employment Scheme, 31 local youth were sponsored for a month-long basic paragliding training in Solang Valley, Himachal Pradesh, in 2006. Following this, the department sent seven select paragliders for an advanced paragliding course of three months from June to September 2007. In 2008, 40 youth underwent basic and intermediate paragliding training at Lachung, north Sikkim from



I January to 30 January. In the same year, under its capacity building programme, the department sent 12 paragliders for an advanced course from 10 August to 16 October at Leading Edge Adventure in Manali. The department also organised a 20-day paragliding basic and intermediate course for 20 Scheduled Tribe paragliders and 10 Scheduled Caste paragliders from March to April 2008 at Yumthang, north Sikkim, and to 40 Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste boys and girls from 28 February to 29 March, 2009 at Daramdin, west Sikkim. Another group of 11 youths were sent to Manali for advanced paragliding course for two months from 16 November to 9 January 2010. This was followed by an advanced tandem paragliding course to four paragliders at Manali from 15 May to 15 July, 2010. In 2011, the department sent 12 para pilots for an advanced course from I March to 25 March in Bir Billing, Himachal Pradesh.

The Sikkim Paragliding Adventure Sports Cooperative Society was formed in 2010. Intermediate and advanced

training of pilots was undertaken in Bir and Billing in Himachal Pradesh, Kamshet in Pune and Pokhara in Nepal with certified schools and instructors.

These trained paragliders have played an instrumental role in promoting Sikkim as a preferred paragliding venue at the global level. Many of Sikkim's trained paragliding pilots, such as Arjun Rai, have not only participated in international events, but are also imparting training to local youths in the state. Arjun Rai has also received the

Sikkim Khel Samman. Sikkim's first woman paragliding pilot, Rinzing Doma Bhutia has represented Sikkim in the World Paragliding Championship. Paragliding sessions at Bulbuley Dara, Ranka and Chakung are conducted by many such commercially qualified and expert paraglider pilots.

The government has plans to diversify paragliding services by creating modern facilities by 2020. New paragliding sites in Tarey Bhir in south Sikkim, Phoktey Dara on the Indo-Nepal border and at Dentam have been identified and inspected by experts.





Cash Incentives

Among other developmental activities undertaken by the Sports department is introduction of cash incentives to the outstanding sports persons, sports competitions and government sponsorship for trainings of athletes.

Cash awards are given on the basis of medals won. Sportspersons winning individual medals in Olympics are given Rs. 2 crore (gold), Rs. I crore (silver), and Rs. 50 lakh (bronze). In Asian Games is Rs. 15 lakhs, Rs. 10 lakhs and Rs. 5 lakhs respectively for gold, silver and bronze medals won. Similarly, sportspersons winning gold, silver and bronze medals in National Games get award respectively of Rs 2 lakhs, Rs. I lakh and Rs. 50,000. In Junior National Championships, Rs. 50,000 is given for those who win gold, Rs. 30,000 for silver and Rs. 20,000 for winning bronze. For details of cash incentives given by the state government to sportspersons, see box in the last pages of this book.

The Sikkim government has also reservation in government jobs for meritorious sportspersons of the state.

Major Tournaments Organised

Late L.D. Kazi Memorial Gold Cup State Level Inter School Football Tournament

The Sports and Youth Affairs Department started Late L.D. Kazi Memorial Gold Cup State Level Inter School Football Tournament in 2014-15 in collaboration with the State Human Resource Development Department.

Similar to its earlier scheme, 'Search for more Bhaichungs', this state-level under-17 inter school football competition is open to all the 68 senior secondary schools. The objective was to rejuvenate the talent pool growth process of a large number of school going students and unearth and nurture potential budding football players to enable secure good football players.

The players of these 68 schools will be divided into 16 clusters of approximately four teams in each cluster. One team from each cluster will qualify for final phase of the tournament which will be held at Chakung football ground. The winning school will represent Sikkim at the Subroto Mukherjee Sports Football Tournament organized by the Subroto Mukherjee Sports Education Society, New Delhi under the banner of Airforce Sports Control Board.

Matches are played in different complex levels and second phase tournament is played at Chakung football ground in West Sikkim.

As an incentive and to boost up professionalism and engagement of school teams, cash awards are also given. The cash award will be used by the winning school for the development and training of school teams.

Lately, Sports and Youth Affairs minister, Mr. R.B. Subba announced a state level tournament for girls on the lines of Late L.D. Kazi Memorial Gold Cup State Level Inter School Football Tournament involving girls of all 68 senior secondary schools. This will be the first ever such platform for the female footballers of Sikkim. Cluster level matches began from 11 July 2016.







Impact: The students of government secondary school, Central Pendam, the winning team of the inaugural tournament represented Sikkim in the 56th edition of Subroto Mukherjee International Football Tournament 2015 in New Delhi in under-17 boys category (28 September to 16 October 2015). Sikkim own three matches: (1) Played against Kolkata (won 2-1); (2) Played against Nicobar Island (Won 3-0); (3) Played against Maharashtra (Won 4-1); Lost against Assam and Mizoram.

Amrit Tamang of government senior secondary school, Central Pendam was picked up by renowned club of India, East Bengal, Kolkata for his outstanding performance. Lately, Amrit has been named in Indian school football team squad for Gothia Cup, the biggest youth football tournament in the world held annually in Gothenburg, Sweden.

Namchi Public School team, the winner of 2015-16 participated in Subroto Mukherjee tournament in New Delhi.

In 2016, the complex level tournament started from April 10, 2016 and second phase held at Chakung school football ground from 22 April to 5 May 2016. The final tournament is slated from 14 September to 21 October 2016.



Rural Sports Competition

Under Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan (RGKA), previously known as Panchayat Yuva Khel Krida Abhiyan (PYKKA), the Sports and Youth Affairs department has successfully hosted and conducted GPU, district and State-level competitions attracting large number of youths towards sports.

PYKKA was launched in 2008-09 to promote sports culture in rural areas by providing basic sports infrastructure and equipment at the Panchayat level and to promote both indigenous and modern games in rural areas through annual competitions. It is a jointly funded sports mission by the State and Centre which has opened up opportunities for rural boys and girls to display their sporting talent. The scheme aims at encouraging sports at grassroots level with a motive to increase the bench strength of players in the country by providing them with basic infrastructure.

Through this scheme, raw talents from rural Sikkim got a state-level platform to get noticed.

The PYKKA games were held at three levels - Village Level, District Level and State Level. It begins at the Zilla Panchayat Unit level wherein players from different blocks compete. The winners then go on to play at the district level moving on to the state level thereafter. The state level winners eventually compete at the national level.

Football and cricket dominate the sporting scene in the rural areas but PYKKA offers the opportunity to explore other games like Kho-Kho, Taekwondo, Boxing etc.

States were provided with an annual competition grant, annual acquisition grant, one time capital grant, technical assistance and capacity building services. Players were also given prize money in competitions to keep them motivated.









During Rural Sports Competition 2014-15.

During 2014-2015, the department organized 31 block, four district and one State-level competitions wherein a total of 163 players were selected to represent state in national-level competition. The competition was conducted in nine disciplines: athletics, taekwondo, badminton, archery, kho kho, volleyball, football, table tennis and boxing.

North East Games and Sports Competitions

Sports competitions and sports festivals have in a way attracted youngsters towards sports and games.

Some of the major sports competitions and sports festivals organised by the department include the national level North East Sports Festival in Gangtok and Mining Ground in 1996, and National Level North East Sports Festival at Gangtok and Mining Ground in 2005-06.

In 2014-15, North East Games under RGKA was organized in all four districts followed by one State level competitions.


In the National level North East Sports Competitions held at Arunachal Pradesh during 2014-15, altogether 106 sportspersons participated. Sikkim won 31 medals: Gold: 04 in taekwondo and wushu; silver: 08 in boxing, taekwondo, karate, wushu; bronze:19 in badminton, boxing, taekwondo, karate, wushu. The competitions were held from December 10,2014 to December 13, 2014 in seven disciplines: athletics, badminton, boxing, football, karate, taekwondo, wushu.

Youth Power and National Integration: Role of NSS, NCC and other Sports Associations in Sikkim

The activities relating to National Cadet Corps (NCC), the National Service Scheme (NSS) and other Sports Associations and the participation of youth in adventure activities and integration camps outside the state is a regular feature.

NSS: One of the Central Schemes of the Ministry of Youth Affairs, NSS activity has been divided into two major groups – regular activities and special camping programme implementation at senior secondary schools, colleges and university.

Cash incentives are given to these organizations to carry out various activities in their respective institutions. Activities include health awareness programmes on drug abuse, HIV/AIDS, alcoholism, smoking, tobacco chewing, cleanliness and plantation drives, and mock drills on disaster management during emergencies like landslides, earthquake, fire, etc. Impact: NSS volunteer Master Abhisek from DAV Public School, NHPC (south Sikkim) and Ms. Manita Rai from Bhojoghari Senior Secondary School, east Sikkim, participated in the Republic Day parade 2015-16 in New Delhi. Sikkim State NSS Unit has also achieved 'Certificate of Appreciation' in second National Service Scheme held in Meghalaya. Similarly, four NSS boys and two girls participated in Bharatiya Chatra Sansad in Pune, Maharashtra.

NCC: There are three Sikkim NCC Batallions and one Sikkim Girls NCC, which provide the youth the opportunity to join the armed forces in future. It organises annual camps involving cadets from all over Sikkim. The cadets have not only taken part in Independence Day and Republic Day parade in Sikkim but also in the Republic Day parade in New Delhi.

Other Sports Associations: With the support given by the state government, 22 state sports associations have been registered.
